Georgia Medicaid EHR Incentive Program - The Georgia Department of Community Health, Division of Health IT, is hosting <a href="free boot camp">free boot camp</a> sessions for Medicaid providers interested in participating in the <a href="Georgia Medicaid EHR Incentive Program">Georgia Medicaid EHR Incentive Program</a>. Eligible providers with a Medicaid patient volume of at least 30 percent can receive up to \$63,750 during their six years of program participation. Participants can choose from one of the following three boot camp sessions scheduled on either April 12 or 13<sup>th</sup>. Evening and morning meeting times are available; the session are held at the State Office of Rural Health in Cordele, Georgia.

Preventive Health Visits for All: On January 1, 2016, adults age 21 and older enrolled in Georgia Medicaid became eligible for coverage of one preventive health visit per calendar year. The preventive health visit includes a medical history, physical exam, health counseling, health screenings (such as Pap tests and mammograms) and Medicaid-covered adult immunizations (such as flu shots). A set of outreach and educational materials designed to help Medicaid members, adults and children, understand the preventive benefits available to them has been created. These outreach materials are available to providers to assist them in educating their members about the importance of preventive health visits and services. Click here to learn more.
