Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Update

Dear Colleagues,

Updates regarding Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) continue to change. Members should remain up-to-date with CDC and AAP changes, which are occurring very frequently. Please use the links below to remain current.

This <u>CDC Health Alert Network (HAN) Update</u>, highlights guidance and recommendations for evaluating and identifying patients who should be tested for COVID-19 that were shared on March 4, 2020, on the CDC COVID-19 website at <u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-nCoV/hcp/clinical-criteria.html</u>. It supersedes the guidance and recommendations provided in CDC's HAN 428 distributed on February 28, 2020.

<u>UPDATED Guidance for Clinicians to Report Possible Cases of 2019 Novel Coronavirus</u> (COVID-19)- GUIDANCE SUBJECT TO CHANGE AS OUTBREAK UNFOLDS

Clinicians who suspect COVID-19 infection in a patient should report them immediately to the Georgia Department of Public Health (DPH) at **1-866-PUB-HLTH (1-866-782-4584)** and ask for a Medical Epidemiologist. At this time, all laboratory testing for COVID-19 is performed at either the CDC or the Georgia Public Health Laboratory and MUST be coordinated by DPH following triage.
