Georgia Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) COVID-19 Update

Georgia WIC has updated their FAQs on their website with additional information pertinent to practices. Notably, USDA has approved waivers that give extensions on many services, including a waiver on physical presence. See excerpt below:

Georgia WIC was also granted a physical presence waiver to assist with completing some WIC services without the need for a participant or applicant to visit the WIC clinic. This includes the required height and weight measurements, as well as lab screenings which are waived as part of the physical presence waiver. If a WIC participant has had a recent doctor's visit, though it is not required, the medical provider can fax measurement and lab information to the WIC clinic using the patient's visit summary or other applicable medical record documentation.

WIC participants are encouraged to contact their local WIC clinic, for information on clinic locations and hours. This info is on the back of the WIC folder, or they may call 1-800-228-9173. Many online services are available as well. Please visit <u>wic.ga.gov</u> for information regarding COVID-19 and additional resources for your patients and for your practice.
