HHS Announces New Provider Relief Funding: The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced a next phase of provider relief funding. It will distribute \$20 billion to pediatricians and other providers who have experienced lost revenue and increased expenses due to COVID-19. Providers will be able to apply from October 5 to November 6. The Georgia Chapter is closely tracking this funding opportunity and will provide more information as it becomes available so stay tuned. Some of the information we have received to date indicate that not all practices may be eligible for this new funding.

Update on CPT Code 87426 - A reminder that CPT code 87426 will pay at a "default rate" of \$15 for Georgia Medicaid until CMS sets a rate for this code. Once the rate has been set, Georgia Medicaid (Mcd) plans to reprocess claims with this code at the higher rate; the Mcd Care Management Organizations are expected to follow this as well. The Mcd fee schedule does have a rate of \$51.31 for CPT 87635 - Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus 2 (SARS COV-2) for dates of services 03/13/2020 through 2/31/2299.
