*Families Should Be Counseled to Celebrate Thanksgiving Safely -* As Thanksgiving Day approaches, the Georgia Chapter recommends discussing with families how to celebrate in a safe manner. **DPH Seeks Covid-19 Vaccine Providers -** Yesterday, all physicians were sent a letter from DPH Commissioner Dr. Kathleen Toomey asking that physicians partner with DPH to distribute COVID-19 vaccines as they become available. In our discussions with DPH, pediatricians are encouraged to sign up now even though it is not yet clear if children will be able to receive the first wave of vaccines. There are at least two steps: filling out the expression of interest survey and later completing the Vaccine Enrollment Packet. To view the letter, please click <u>here</u>.

*Important Georgia U.S. Senate Run-off Election Dates -* On Jan 5, Georgia will have two important Senate run-off races: Kelley Loeffler (R) vs. John Ossoff (D); and Raphael Warnock (D) vs. David Perdue (R).

Here are some important dates for families to be aware of:

Nov. 18: Absentee ballots begin going out

- Dec. 7: Deadline to register
- Dec. 14: Early In-Person voting begins
- Jan. 1 Deadline to request an absentee ballot
- Jan. 5: Election Day. Absentee ballots must be returned by 7 p.m. on Jan. 5.

\*An adolescent who is 17 years old may register to vote if they turn 18 years old by January 5, 2021.

The Call for Proposals is open through Jan. 27.
