Medicaid COVID-19/General News of Note - Georgia Department of Community Health (DCH) has now entered a value for CPT Code 87426 Infectious agent antigen detection by immunoassay technique and reports this code will pay both physicians and providers \$36.18. Previously processed claims with this code will be adjusted to reflect this payment increase. In general Medicaid news, we have some updates regarding payments and the Wellcare - Peach State Health Plan (PSHP) merger. First, all of the four GA Medicaid Care Management Organizations have begun to pay the 1% increase on the selected 109 CPT codes and are reprocessing claims back to 7/1/2020 to reflect this payment increase. Secondly, the Chapter has successfully advocated to ensure that the Georgia Medicaid CMOs pay PAs and NPs 100% of either the Medicaid maximum allowable amount or the enhanced rate for EPSDT – Health Check services. This correct payment should be reflected in new day claims and through the reprocessing of previously submitted claims. Thirdly, as the Wellcare/Peach State Health Plan remains on track to complete their May 1 merger, members are encouraged to consider reaching out to PSHP to discuss contracting options as this may impact their Wellcare patient panel. Lastly, we are happy to announce that April Hartman, MD of Augusta University has agreed to serve as our Medicaid Task Force Chair. She will lead our bi-monthly calls with DCH and the CMOs and intends to host a virtual meeting of the full Medicaid Task Force in the coming months.

Georgia AAP Publishes "Get Out and Vote" Web Page - As you may know, an unusual thing happened in the November election in Georgia: both US Senate seats were up for election and both will be decided by a run-off election held on Jan. 5, 2021. DPH Seeks COVID-19 Vaccine Providers - On Nov. 17, all physicians were sent a letter from DPH Commissioner Dr. Kathleen Toomey asking that physicians partner with DPH to distribute COVID-19 vaccines as they become available. In our discussions with DPH, pediatricians are encouraged to sign up now even though it is not yet clear if children will be able to receive the first wave of vaccines. There are at least two steps: filling out the expression of interest survey and later completing the Vaccine Enrollment Packet. To view the letter, please click here.
